A program created and launched by Tupperware Brands Corporation and Rollins College, supported by The Secretary's Office of Global Women's Issues at the U.S. Department of State

The United States Secretary of State's Office of Global Women's Issues and Tupperware Brands Corporation, in coordination with Rollins College Crummer Graduate School of Business, is accepting applications for a Brazilian female college/university educator to participate in the Global Scholar in Residence Program. The program is a capacity-building "train-the-trainer" model designed to expand entrepreneurship opportunities for women in Brazil. The Program begins with an up to nine-month intensive education and business practicum program will be conducted in the United States in English.

Target Audience

Program partners welcome applications from Brazilian female assistant/associate/full-professors currently serving as an educator at an accredited University or College in Brazil. Preference will be given to candidates in economics/business disciplines.

Program Objectives

The purpose of the Global Links program is to:

- Inspire the development of a new generation of entrepreneurs in Brazil through a model that has the potential to reach hundreds of Brazilian university students and female entrepreneurs while positively impacting the lives of American students.
- Build capacity of a promising, dedicated female university or college assistant/associate/full-professor interested in developing female entrepreneurship in Brazil.
- Develop business experience and skills through an externship in a multi-billion-dollar public company.
- Expand pedagogical and teaching proficiencies through mentoring provided by a leading academic institution in the United States.

Selection Process

- August 2018 – Applications disseminated
- September 2018 – Selection of 3 semi-finalist candidates to enter final selection process
- October 2018 – Plan development for final selection
 - Three semi-finalists develop a plan for community learning and engagement based on the tenets of social entrepreneurship and guidelines provided
 - Connects with NGO or social enterprise working in scholar's local community that will cooperate on engagement learning activities

- Candidates submit preliminary plan to Global Links sponsors for consideration of final selection
- October 2018 – Final selection of 2019 Scholar

Program Content

Phase I: Six-month program in Orlando, Florida from February 2019 to July 2019

- Business fundamental coursework at Rollins College
- Externship at corporate partner headquarters (i.e., Tupperware Brands)
- One-on-one mentoring from a Rollins College Crummer Graduate School of Business professor
- Exposure to U.S. academic culture and entrepreneurs

Phase II: Seven-month community learning and engagement plan implemented in Brazil with 20-30 students and partner NGO / social enterprise (August 2019 - February 2020)

- Program planning and student recruitment: August - September 2019
- Plan implementation: October 2019 – February 2020
- Selection of students for participation in Phase III by April 2020

Phase III: Two-week educational immersion in Orlando, Florida in Fall 2020 (exact dates TBD)

- Together with five Brazilian university students, scholar returns to the USA to interact with Rollins' students in a two-week immersion program focused on social entrepreneurship
- Reports on process of learning and impact of Phases I and II
- Visit sponsoring corporate offices and local social enterprises

Scholar Support:

In addition to a monthly living allowance, the corporate partner will sponsor scholar's Program-related expenses, including:

- Round-trip travel from Brazil to Orlando at the beginning and end of the program
- Program-related domestic travel
- A furnished apartment at Rollins College during Phase I
- Books and resources needed for study
- Budget to implement Phase II
- Travel and accommodation expenses for students and scholar in Phase III provided by Rollins.

Scholar's Commitment:

Phase I

- Participate actively in all program activities
- Represent Global Links in a professional manner at all times
- Communicate frequently and openly regarding program activities, including written monthly reports
- Conduct presentations at Rollins, corporate partner offices, professional associations, and in the community as appropriate
- Secure partnership with NGO or social enterprise in Brazil and develop Phase II plan

Phase II

- Raise awareness of Global Links at home university to recruit students to the program
- Teach students, faculty, and local community about Global Links and social entrepreneurship
- Oversee interactions among students and NGO/social enterprise partner
- Document progress of Phase II and report to program partners on a regular basis, including written reports

- Assist in selection of students to participate in Phase III

Phase III

- Work with Rollins and corporate partner to develop and deploy immersion program
- Travel with students to USA for Phase III two-week immersion program

Program Participation Requirements

To be considered for selection, interested parties must meet the following criteria:

- Female
- Currently employed as an assistant/associate/full-professor at an accredited college or university in Brazil, preference given to candidates in economics or business disciplines
- Can provide written support for participation in the program from current employer
- Fluent in English
- Familiar with using computers in a work environment
- A citizen of Brazil, currently living in Brazil
- Not in the process of applying for U.S. immigrant status
- Able to be in the U.S. for six months beginning in February 2019
- Hold a current, valid Brazilian passport with expiration date after December 2019
- Able to obtain a visa to travel to the USA and cover all associated costs

Application Process

1. Complete the application
2. Attach a C.V. or current resume (word document or pdf format only)
3. Attach a written statement of three professional accomplishments in the last one to two years
4. Explain how this program fits in with personal and professional goals
5. If selected as one of the 3 finalists: Submit a potential plan for Phase II of the program including potential partners in Brazil (indicating existing relationships with them)
